CO-OPERATIVE STORES.

Bangabasi College Co-operative Stores Limited was registered under the Co-operative Society's Act in July 1918 and its practical operations commenced soon after. Within a short time, more than three hundred shares of Rs. 5 each were subscribed by the Students and Professors of the College, although the venture was quite a new one and not in accordance with the ordinary academic wa, of thinking common amongst students and teachers alike. The movement, however, received an unexpected check from November till the re-opening of the College in July. The College was practically in a state of hibernation during these months due to the absence of students for influenza-epidemic, the University Examinations and long vacations. In spite of these deterrent causes, the Stores have made a very fair progress.
