Nani Gopal Mukherjea favoured the company with some entrancing songs. The party dispersed at a pretty late, hour of the night after doing full justice to a pleasant variety of dishes hospitably provided by the new Secretaries.

The third sitting of the COLLEGE UNION came off on Saturday, the 18th September, at 7 P.M. The attendance was very thin, probably because most of the members were ill or otherwise indisposed.
