This over, the president, our revered professor D. N. Mukherji, delivered a short, but neat lecture to let the members know the functions of the Association. After this with a vote of thanks to the chair the members rose for the day.

After enjoying the pleasant company of Dr. Profulla Chandra for nearly two hours, the meeting terminated.
