INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION IN ARTS FOR 1909 AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS.

COMPULSORY.

1. English: Three papers.

Two papers on Poetry Texts and Prose Texts; the third paper will contain an Essay (40 marks), Prosody and Rhetoric (20 marks), and unseen passages taken from books not more difficult than those recommended for the Matriculation (40 marks).

II. Vernacular Composition: One Paper.—For details see Matriculation.

An alternative paper in English for those whose vernacular is not recognised.

And three other subjects, of which not more than one may be a Science subject; two papers in each subject:—

A classical language, or French or German; History (England, one paper, Greece and Rome, one paper); Logic (Deductive and Inductive); Mathematics (Algebra, Plane Trigonometry, Conics, Solid Geometry.—one paper; Elementary Statics and Dynamics—one paper); and several Science subjects.

Each paper carries 100 marks.
