It is a pleasure to find several of our Old Boys obtain high places at the last M. A., and M Sc. Examinations. We record their names and achievements below:—

- (1) Sriman Gauripati Chatterjee, who graduated from this College with Distinction and also matriculated from the College-School, has stood first in the First Class in Physics (Group C.) at the M. Sc. Examination.
- (2) Sriman Phanilal Mullik, who stood fourth in order of merit at the I. Sc. Examination from this College, has stood first in the First Class in Pure Mathematics at the M. Sc. Examination.
- (3) Srijut Akshaykumar Sarkar M. A. (History), who graduated from this College in 1902, has stood second in the First Class in Political Economy and Political Philosophy (Group A) at the M. A. Examination.

- (4) Srijut Jyotischandra Ghatak M. A. (Sanskrit), who graduated from this College with Honours in Sanskrit in 1915, has been the only student who has attained the unique distinction of passing (Class II.) in a new subject viz. Ancient Indian History and Culture at the M. A. Examination.
- (5) Sriman Satischandra Bhattacharyya, who matriculated from the College-School, has stood first in the Second Class in English (Group B) at the M. A. Examination.
