THE COLLEGE ASSOCIATION.

The Third Meeting of the Bangabasi College Association was held on Saturday the 23rd August in Room 1. at 3-15 P. M. Despite the late commencement of the meeting, there was a fair attendance of students. Our sincere thanks go to Professor Rajkumar Chakravarti, M. A. who very kindly presided on the occasion.

The Report of the Proceedings of the last meeting of the Association as well as that of the proceedings of the last Social Gathering organised by the Association being read out by the Secretary and confirmed by the meeting, the President called upon the estimates of the day to read their papers on 'How to spend the Long Vacation.' Sj. 'andra Bose of the 2nd Year I. Sc. Class

in his well-written essay chiefly dwelt on the need of developing the literary taste during the Vacation by reading books other than the prescribed texts.

Then Sj. Durgadas Chatterjee of the 4th Year B. A. Class, rad out his paper, in which there was a hint given to the students of the strenuous work that awaited them on their leaving the University. He exhorted his audience to prepare for that strenuous struggle, (প্ৰপিশতেন)—by bowing down to the Lord with heart kindled by natural piety, (প্রিপ্রেশন)—by searching after that and (সেব্য়া)—by helping the distressed and the needy.

Sj. Basantakumar Ghose criticised the two papers and remarked that the essayists had rather overshot the mark—Student-life was not for carrying on philanthropic works so much as for storing up knowledge true and perfect, so that when the time comes, each one of the students will be ready for the fight.

The President then expressed great satisfaction at the two papers writter in an erudite style. He then wound up the debate, saying that both intell tual culture and execution of humane work were necessary.

The subject for the next debate to be held on the 30th August 1919 was fixed as follows:—

The 4th meeting of the Bangabasi College Association came off on Saturaday the 30th August in Room 1., at 2-15 P. M.

Prof. Jitendranath Chakravarti M. A, presided and there was a fair attendence of students. The selected subject for debate—Prose. vs. Poetry—had to be dropped as both of the essayists—Sj. Sukumar Guha and Sj. Kshitischandra Roy were absent. A new subject 'Village life. vs. City life' was chosen on the spot. It is a hopeful sign that there were several extempore speakers including 1st and 3rd Year Students. An animated debate ensued, in which some of the esteemed Professors joined. Prof. Rajkumar Chakravarti M. A. patched up a reconciliation between the advocates of the two sides, with the comment that the city and the village were inter-dependent. The President remarked that his opinion was the same as that of his learned colleague and that he would have liked to deal more fully with the question but there was hardly enough time for the purpose.

The Secretary proposed that a Social Gathering be held on the eve of the Puja vacation like the one held on the eve of the Long Vacation. The proposal was carried and with a vote of thanks to the chair the meeting terminated.
